RANDOLPH CITIZEN INITIATIVE – Redistricting Randolph House Districts

We, the below-signed registered voters of Randolph Massachusetts, hereby request that the Town Council and the Town of Randolph pursue all possible political action and all possible legal action to ensure the following:

- *Randolph is currently split into three House districts--1st Norfolk; 5th Norfolk; and 7th Norfolk, based on 2010 redistricting.*
- *Because our town is under half of each of three districts, no resident of Randolph has been elected to the legislature in decades.*
- *Randolph's population in the 2020 census is sufficient to create a single Randolph-centered House district.*
- *We expect the Joint Committee on Redistricting to create a Randolph-centered House district for the 2022 election.*
